The following contains excerpts from "How Criticizing in Private Undermines Your Team" by Roger Schwarz.....

"Praise in public, criticize in private." Most of us have grown up on those words and believe the old adage. Often when a team member does something that negatively impacts the team, he/she is usually talked to privately. But this can be a dangerous path to follow because it significantly reduces accountability, the quality of team decisions, and the team's ability to manage itself.

For behavior that happens in a meeting or that affects the team, if you criticize in private it undermines team members' accountability to one another and sends the message that the team member is only accountable to you; not the team. It sends the message that the members don't need to be accountable to each other; you will do it FOR them. It also makes it difficult to solve the problem. By stating that you want a team in which members can openly and constructively give each other feedback in the team, members may form a new mindset so they see themselves accountable to the team; not just to the leadership.

The key is learning how to discuss each other's behavior in a way that's productive and doesn't contribute to defensive reactions. Matthew 5:22 in the Bible says, "But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, 'You fool!' will be liable to the hell of fire". My friends, I have been guilty of this myself.

Sound leadership isn't about being comfortable. It IS about being efficient even when you are UN-comfortable.
